Workshop 7: My Health Record use as part of allied health clinical practice

Overview:

This workshop will introduce My Health Record with a specific focus on use by allied health practitioners. It will also provide an overview of the My Health Record expansion program, which includes the move to a national opt-out consumer recruitment system and a range of enhancements to My Health Record. The workshop will include presentations by allied health practitioners who are currently accessing and contributing to My Health Record. Participants will have the opportunity via discussion groups to identify the benefits of using the My Health Record, discuss the issues and barriers that allied health practitioners may encounter, and explore the strategies allied health practitioners can adopt to incorporate the My Health Record into their clinical practice.
